- As a founder of The Asian Center, initiated leadership and direction for the board of directors, executive committee, various working committees, contracted staff, and grant contracting.
- Assess the needs of Asian Americans in the West Michigan by acquiring grant funding.
- Design and implement culturally sensitive workshops to educate the area's human service professionals, agencies, and institutes.
- Assure quality program development by on-going evaluation.
- Develop an Asian Center Hour weekly show to build a multi-cultural community through mass media by introducing Asian cultures.

Major Accomplishments

- Trained 40 Asian leaders from various groups and integrated them into a mutual support network.
- Assessed the area's Asian American needs for service programs, designed and implemented them for grant funding.
- Instituted a counseling office and secured commitments of office supports from Grand Valley State University for the agency establishment.
- Funded programs for The Asian Center by acquiring grants for programs.
- Created exemplary partnerships with business agencies and significantly introduced Asian culturally sensitive workshops.

- Negotiated five free rental spaces via agreement with other agencies to deliver and expand Pleasant Heart Program, a mind, body and spirit Qigong integrated program to prevent and heal high blood pressure and cholesterol in different parts of the city.
- Received and implement 22 grants from foundations, local and state agencies for program operation which has strengthened the Asian Center's financial condition.
